The Philomath Community Foundation will award a \$500 scholarship to a graduating Philomath High School Senior who wants assistance to help cover cost for college or post-secondary school technical training. Emphasis for the award will be for those students that have overcome some form of hardship (physical, emotional, health, etc.) that emulates the name of the scholarship. The student needs to be trustworthy, respected by his/her peers and reliable. The award will also be to students who need assistance that might not be available from other sources.

Eligibility requirements for receiving the scholarship:

- 1. Student must be from the Philomath School District with a cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- 2. Attend Philomath High School for 2 academic years unless waived by the principal.
- 3. Pass required state testing.
- 4. Attach a copy of your high school transcript.
